Advancing Thanksgiving

In the last two weeks there have been many prayer opportunities for asking God for his healing care. There have been eight St. John members this week alone recovering from surgeries; not one of the procedures was a minor medical office visit. Each will require God's care to bring full mending and will require His loving presence as the mind and soul are affected by what our bodies experience as well.

Spend some time in Psalm 42 which was written for shared worship in the temple in Jerusalem. This and Psalm 43 are closely related and together include the lament of a temple singer who has been cut off from worship with others due to circumstances that have kept him away from Jerusalem. The writer likely had experienced the effects of drought, and he likens that experience to the thirst and longing for God and His people. As a deer pants for flowing streams, so pants my soul for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. (vv.1-2).

The writer, too, is fully upfront with God that the longings of his heart and soul are for joy and ease to return as he is presently in the midst of suffering.

Illness and pain can knock us off balance, too. The writer says, **Deep calls to deep at the roar of your waterfalls**; all your breakers and your waves have gone over me. (v.7).

I recall times growing up in California of being broadsided by coastal waves and feeling like a ragdoll in the powerful, tumbling breakers. When we are in need of healing—be it a need for healing of the soul, mind, body or relationship—our steps feel uncertain, unsteady and even threatening at times. We can feel tossed about without a sense of control. These feelings can also come to family members and friends who witness the difficulty.

Even at that, the Psalm writer advances confidence and thanksgiving. I say "advances" because he may not feel confident yet, and he may not feel thankful in the moment. He advances confidence and thanksgiving because of his faith in a gracious and powerful God whom he believes will restore. Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God. (v.5). And again he praises God with these words: Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God. (v.11).

"But God showed his great love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners. And since we have been made right in God's sight by the blood of Christ, he will certainly save us from God's condemnation."

Remans 5:8-9

Jesus, the One who is our salvation and our God, has advanced to us His grace, mercy and forgiveness. Paul tells us, God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. (Romans 5:8-9).

That advanced love from Jesus causes us to Advance Him Thanksgiving as we lift up our needs and the needs of our fellow members, family members and friends who need His attentive care as well.



St. John offers care-giving through the Stephen Ministry Program

Stephen Ministers are congregation members trained by Stephen Leaders to offer high-quality, *confidential*, one-to-one Christian care to people going through tough times. A Stephen Minister usually provides care to one person at a time, meeting with them once a week for about an hour. St. John currently has 9 trained Stephen Ministers.

<u>Care Receivers</u> are people - congregation members *and others* in the community - who receive care from a Stephen Minister. A person does <u>not</u> need to be a member at St. John or of any faith community to receive care. Care receivers are people struggling through a difficult time in life - experiencing grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or any life crisis.
